

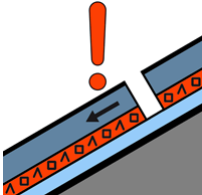

Avalanche Problems



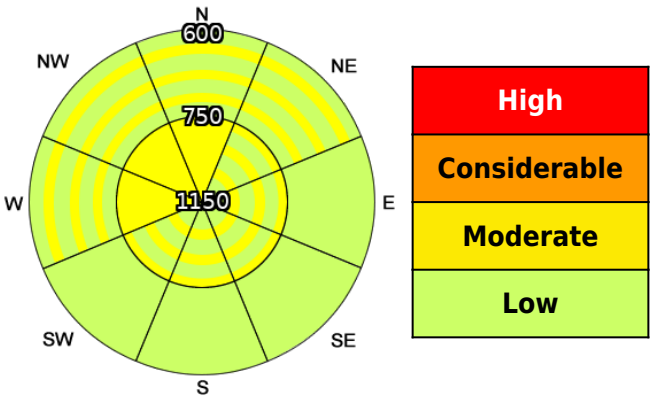
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little changes is expected in the snowpack. Areas of moderately bonded hard windslab will remain on many aspects. Most affected will be North to West aspects above 750 metres. These areas won't be particularly extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain dry with strong East-South-East winds. There will be no clearly defined freezing level, with temperatures creeping up towards freezing at all levels.
