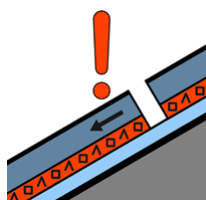
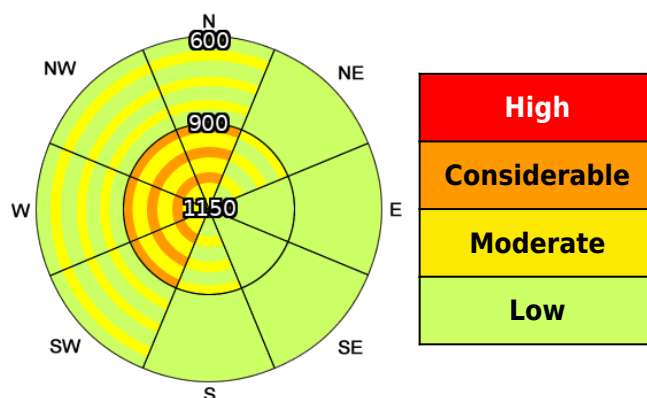


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 14/02/2017****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Moderately to weakly bonded windslab will persist in steep, sheltered locations on South-West through West to North aspects above 900 metres. With steep terrain, convex slopes, gully exits and scarp slopes most affected. Wind exposed terrain and ridges will be firm with improved stability. At lower levels deeper drifts will be found in sheltered hollows and burn lines. Cornice stability will remain suspect. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Mainly cloudy with isolated snow flurries. Remaining cold with the strong East-South-East winds backing to the East early morning.

Comments

Some minor snow loss of thinner cover at lower levels today. Likely to become warmer later this week.
