



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 17/02/2017

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The stable but thawing and patchy snowpack will continue to diminish, with most snow confined to strips and runnels, North to East aspects, mainly on coire rims, ridge flanks and gully exits above 750 metres, Most hillsides, summits and summit ridges will remain bare. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a generally dry and overcast day with some occasional brighter spells and it will remain mild with the freezing level rising well above the summits by mid-morning. The North-West wind will ease overnight, but will gradually freshen through the day, backing South-South-East.

Comments

The previously shallow snowpack has diminished greatly in the thaw.
