

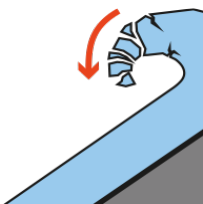

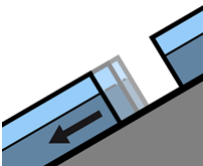

Wet Snow



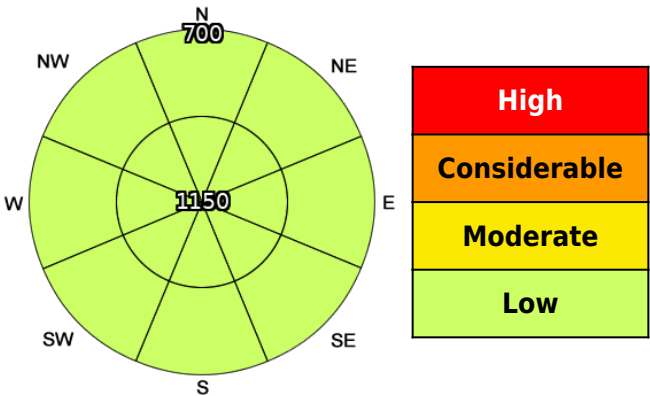
Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Isolated and localised wet snow instabilities will be present on steeper slopes mostly on North-West though North to East aspects above 850 metres. On other aspects and at lower elevations the remaining snowpack will be generally stable. Remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mild weather will continue to affect the area with thaw conditions at all elevations. Overnight, rain will fall at all levels this will continue through most of the day with the odd drier spell early afternoon. Fresh to strong Southerly winds will veer during the day becoming South-West and the freezing level will remain above the summits.

Comments

Slightly more wintry on Saturday evening with the possibility of new snow over the summits but getting milder again on Sunday.
