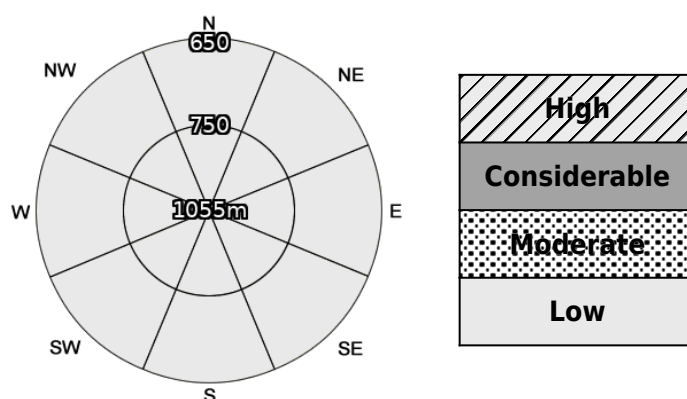


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 20/02/2017****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The very patchy and depleted snowpack will continue to thaw at all levels and will remain stable. Heavy overnight rain will saturate the snowpack and at the end of the day, a surface crust may develop above 900 metres with perhaps a light dusting of new snow above 800 metres; however, amounts will be insignificant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight rain will ease by daybreak as a cold front pushes eastwards, allowing the freezing level to drop below the summits in the afternoon with perhaps a light dusting of snow. It will stay cloudy with a fresh to strong Westerly wind.
