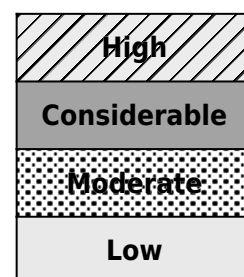
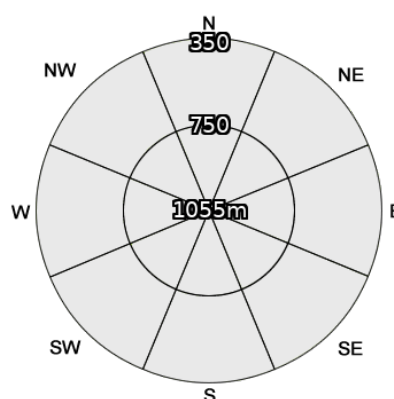

There will be a light covering of fresh snow above 350 metres. Minor accumulations of fresh snow will develop in very sheltered locations on North-East to South-East aspects but amounts are not likely to be significant. This snow will be redistributed as the wind changes direction. The very few patches of old snow will remain well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low

**Forecast Weather Influences**

The Westerly wind will gradually ease during the night with showers dying out. As Storm Doris approaches the wind will increase in strength and back South-East to East then North to North-West and start to ease by mid morning. Showers are forecast later in the day falling as snow above 350 metres.
