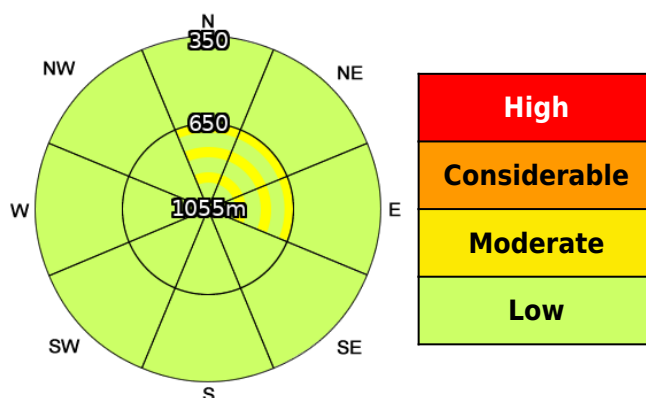

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Pockets of moderately well bonded windslab will develop in localised steep sheltered locations, mainly above 650 metres. Most affected will be coire rims, ridge flanks and summit slopes on North to East aspects, particularly where it overlies the existing snowpack. Possible minor cornice development above steep slopes on the same aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Evening snow, then snow showers overnight and through the morning will ease by the afternoon. Snow will lie above 300 metres as the daytime freezing level hovers around 350 metres. Strong South-West winds overnight will gradually moderate through the day, backing South later.

Comments
