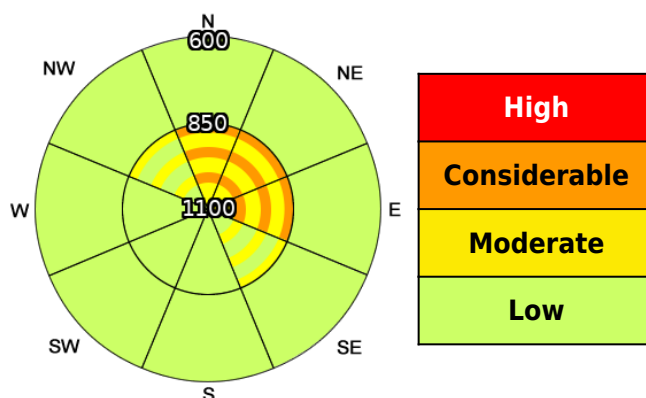

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh marginally bonded windslab will exist in steep, sheltered gully exits on mainly North to East aspects above 850 metres, with some cross-loading on other steep gully flanks. New weak cornice development is also expected in coire backwalls of these aspects. Good stability on all ridges and wind-exposed locations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Cooler with freezing levels overnight remaining below summits and further lowering to around 300m during the day. Overnight snow showers will die out as daylight approaches, the strong South-Westerly winds will ease and become light Southerly.
