

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to build on East through South to South-West aspects above 650 metres. Cornices will continue to build on these aspects. The colder temperatures will maintain some underlying weaknesses in the existing windslab deposits especially on North- East to South-East and South-West to West aspects above 650 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Frequent heavy snow showers are expected. Moderate North-North-West winds will back North-Westerly becoming fresh Westerly tomorrow afternoon. The freezing level will lower to remain around 300 metres.

Comments

Feeling cold on the wind exposed summits, warm in sheltered corries. Generally nice travel conditions with some deep snow in places where sensible route choice is important on wind sheltered zones where unstable windslab is present.
