

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 03/03/2017


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be some consolidation of recent accumulations but deeper areas of moderately bonded windslab will be present in sheltered locations mostly on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Greatest hazard will be found in gully exits, corrie rims, convex features and crag aprons. North and South aspects will also be affected by cross loading. Elsewhere, slopes exposed to the winds will be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A much calmer day is expected. Winds will be Easterly and generally light throughout the day. It will remain dry with a slight rise in the freezing level to around 800 metres.
