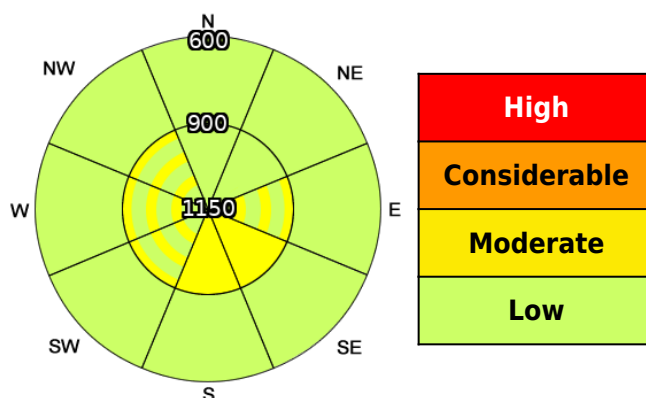


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 04/03/2017****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Areas of moderately bonded windslab will develop in steep, sheltered locations on East through South to North-West aspects above 900 metres. These areas will be mostly shallow and generally avoidable but deeper accumulations will be found particularly on South-East and South aspects. Elsewhere, terrain exposed to the winds will be well bonded or scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Starting overnight, there will be light snowfall above 600 metres, but, as freezing levels rise, this will be restricted to the summits with rain at lower levels by the end of the afternoon. Winds will be strong, initially from the East-North-East but easing from mid morning and becoming North-East.

Comments

Freezing levels will rise during the day to around 1000 metres by the end of the afternoon.
