





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will a redistribution of snow creating localised areas of unstable windslab on South through West to North facing slopes above 750 metres. Sheltered steep lee areas such as corrie rims and gully exits will be most affected. Easterly aspects may still have localised areas of unstable windslab but these will gradually become scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Strengthening wind overnight, becoming East-South-East and very strong by early morning. There will be light showers during the day falling as snow initially above 300 metres then rising to around 700 metres.
