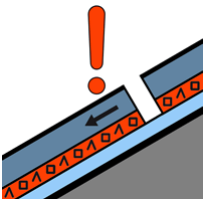


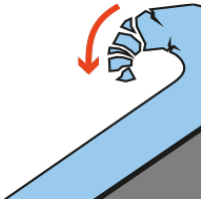

Avalanche Problems



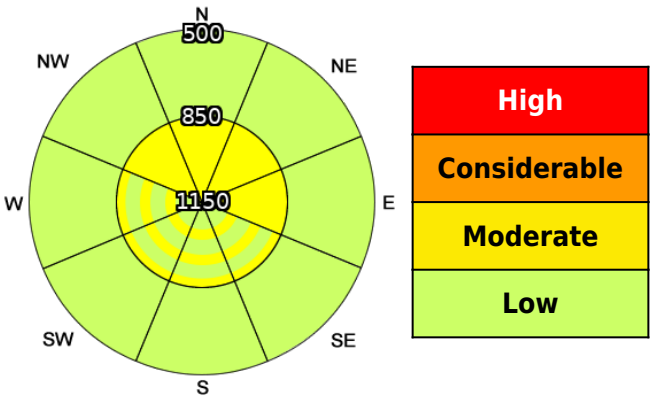
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow amounts are not expected to be significant. Areas of moderately bonded windslab will persist mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 850 metres. Instabilities will be most significant on steeper terrain, coire rims and sheltered gullie exits. Cornices will be fragile. Other sheltered aspects may have isolated pockets of instabilities. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mainly dry through the forecast period, maybe the odd scattered light snow shower but not significant snow fall. Light South-Easterly winds will veer to the West-South-West and strengthen. The freezing level will be around 800 metres.

Comments

Some partial consolidation of the snowpack has taken place but localised instabilities remain.
