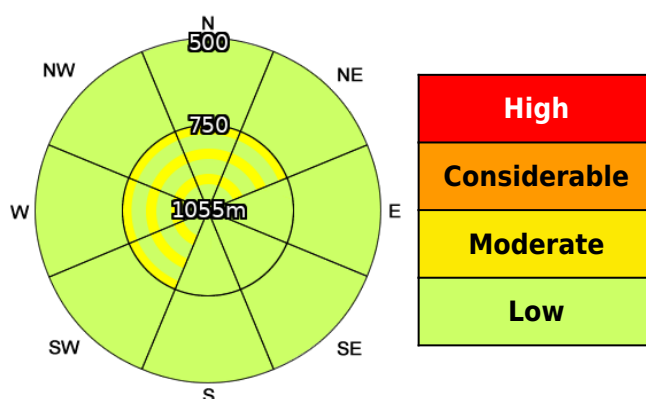


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 06/03/2017****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Localised areas of moderately bonded windslab will remain in very sheltered areas on South-West to North-West aspects above 750 metres. The tops of steep slopes and gullies will be most affected. There may be some redistribution of snow during the day leading to very localised slab build up on steep North to North-East slopes. Once again it will be gully exits and corrie rims that will be affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Light South-East wind veering South-West and strengthening during the day. The freezing level will drop during the night and rise to around 650 metres. Some very light showers during the day but no significant amounts forecast.

Comments

The cloud gradually dissipated and the main summits were in the sunshine by late morning. A nice contrast to yesterday. Some quite deep accumulations of snow in places. Thanks to the group ahead of me in Coire Laoigh on Beinn Eighe for breaking trail.
