Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack below 800 metres will remain generally well bonded and stable in all locations. In steep gully flanks and exits above 950 metres, mostly in sheltered North-West through North to North-Easterly aspects areas of marginally bonded windslab will persist, also in some other sheltered pockets. Recently formed cornices will remain fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Little change. It will be mostly dry with only the isolated snow shower above 600 metres. The winds will be light to fresh and generally Southerly throughout (SE, S then SW). Freezing levels will remain below summits.

Comments

Still wintry up high, but a very definite spring feel at lower elevations.
