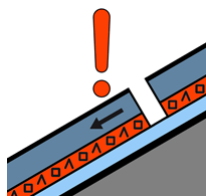
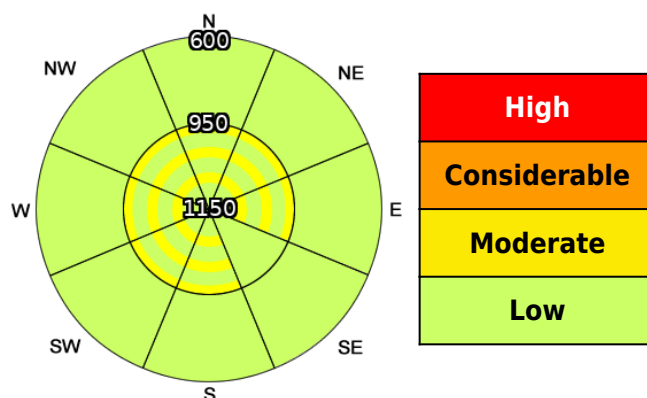


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 07/03/2017****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Initially, localised areas of moderately bonded snow will be present in steeper, sheltered locations on South-through West to North aspects from 1000 metres, with occasional pockets being found on some East aspects. As the winds increase during the afternoon increasing amounts of redistribution will occur with fresh windslab being deposited on mainly North-West to North-East aspects from 950 metres. Exposed slopes will start to become scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Generally dry with just a trace of snow at the end of the period. Overnight light variable winds will become South-South-Westerly by morning and then increase to strong Southerlies during the afternoon. Freezing level lowering to 650 metres overnight before gradually rising to 800 metres by the end of the period.

Comments

Significant volume of snow available for redistribution as the winds increase.
