





Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to improve and stabilise in all areas. Cooler temperatures overnight will result in a refrozen and stable snowpack at lower levels. Some residual instabilities will persist but only in the steepest slopes above 1000 metres on West to East facing slopes, with steep and convex or pillow shaped terrain high in coire back-walls and gully exits most affected. Collapsing cornices will remain a threat on Northerly facing slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation is expected during the forecast period. Freezing levels will be around 600 metres rising slowly from around mid afternoon. Winds will be light West-South-Westerly gradually backing Southerly and becoming strong during the afternoon.
