

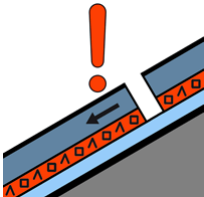

Wind Slab



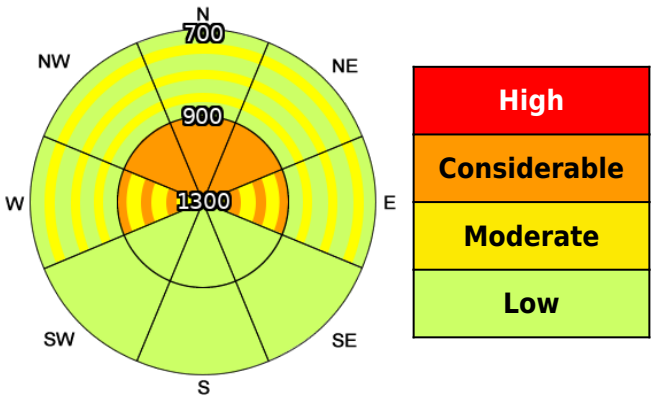

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New unstable accumulations of windslab will form on mainly North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres, gully exits, coire rims, and steep terrain high in coire back-walls will be most affected. West and East aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. Below this level it will be generally stable with localised moderately bonded deposits in wind sheltered places. Cornices above all Northerly slopes will be liable to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall is expected above 700 metres, mostly overnight with snow-showers throughout the rest of the forecast period. Winds will be very strong South-South-Easterly veering and becoming West-South-Westerly by daybreak. Freezing level around 900 metres.

Comments

A stormy period ahead, very wintry above 700 metres.
