

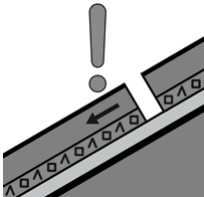

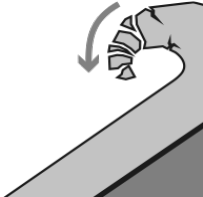

Wind Slab



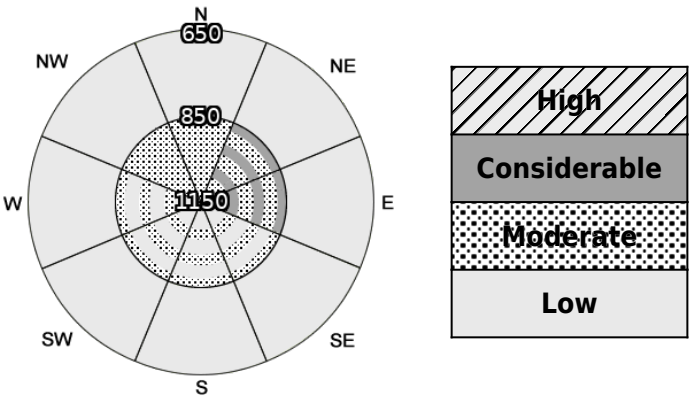
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of unstable windslab will form, mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 850 metres. Greatest accumulations are expected on North-East and East aspects particularly the tops of gullies and corrie rims, although sheltered areas on many aspects may be affected. Cornices will continue to develop and be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers will fall as snow above 600 metres overnight, then mainly above 900 metres through the day. The freezing level will rise in the evening peaking briefly above the level of the tops around midnight before falling and settling at around 900 metres from morning . The strong South-South-East wind will strengthen, peaking at mid-day, then veering West-South-Westerly.
