

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Unstable windslab will form mainly above 850 metres in sheltered locations such as gullies and hollows and on slopes with a North through East to South-Easterly aspect, greatest accumulations are expected to be in North-East to East aspects particularly the tops of gullies and corniced areas. Other aspects may be affected due to cross loading. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Snow showers above 800 metres overnight becoming dry by morning. Winds will be South-Westerly strong overnight becoming mainly West-North-West and decreasing through the course of the day. The freezing level will be around 700 metres through the day.

**Comments**

Large cornices will be prone to collapse. Becoming dryer and less windy.
