Moderately to weakly bonded windslab will persist in steeper, sheltered locations on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Cross-loading will also affect North-West and South aspects. Gullies, corrie headwalls and convex features will be worst affected. Deeper deposits will also be found in sheltered locations below this altitude. Recently formed cornices will remain fragile. Wind exposed slopes will be scoured and generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Light snowfall overnight down to around 800 metres then dry during the day. The freezing level will lift to around 1000 metres by the end of the afternoon. Winds will remain very strong, West and South-West overnight then veering to the North-West during the day.
