



**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Rising temperatures with light rain will induce a period of wet surface snow instability in accumulations of recent windslab on steep slopes, mainly North, through East to South aspects above 800 metres. Most affected will be scarp slopes, ridge flanks, coire rims and gully exits. Below this level, the thawing snowpack will generally consolidate. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

During the day, it will remain overcast with some hill cloud and patchy light rain at all levels as the freezing level rises above the summits overnight. The Westerly wind will also ease overnight, backing South-East and freshening by daybreak, veering South later.

**Comments**

Some older deep snowdrifts remain. Icy crust present in exposed areas at summit levels.
