Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will gradually thaw as milder, but mainly dry conditions affect the area. The snowpack will become generally soft and moist with a general consolidation occurring. Where deeper areas of old windslab exist mainly in sheltered gullies and on steep North to East slopes above 1000 metres wet snow instabilities will be likely. These areas may also be threatened by large weak cornice collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

Forecast Weather Influences

Mainly dry but with some very light precipitation through the earlier part of the day. It will become milder with freezing levels rising well above the summits. Winds will fresh to strong from the South East.
