

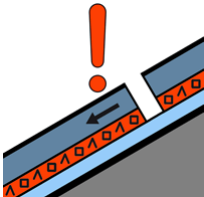

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 10/03/2017

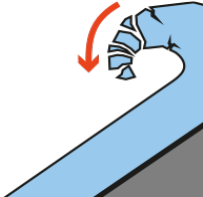
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



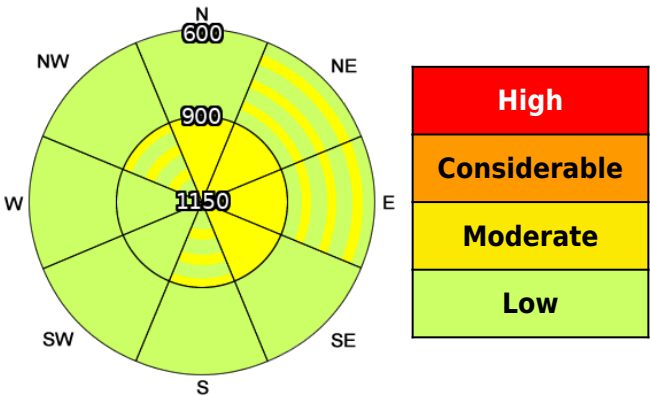
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be some general consolidation of the snowpack but windslab will only be moderately well bonded on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Greatest hazard will be found in gully exits, scarp slopes and on convex slopes. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Elsewhere, isolated pockets of moderately bonded windslab will be found in steep sheltered terrain with recently exposed slopes scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be an occasional light snow flurry but otherwise it will be dry. The freezing level will rise throughout the day to above the summits. Winds will be moderate in strength, mainly South-South-East but backing Southerly by the end of the day.
