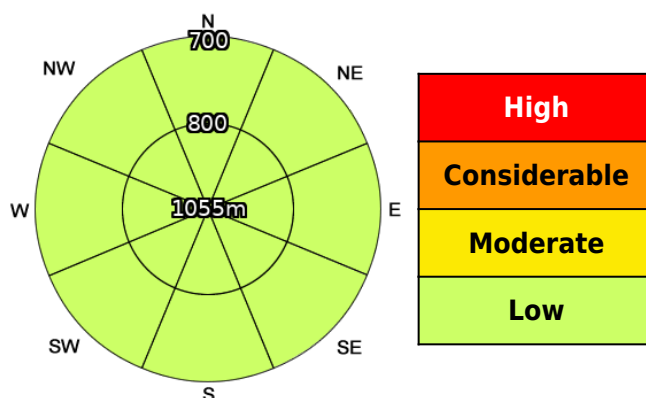
Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The diminishing snowpack will continue to thaw at all levels. A surface crust may develop above 900 metres later in the period. Areas where there is depth to the snowpack will remain mainly around gully exits and corrie rims above 800 metres on North-West through North to Easterly aspects. This snowpack will be generally stable and well bonded. Many hillsides, summits and summit ridges will remain completely bare. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

A weak cold front will introduce some colder air with freezing level dropping to around summits by mid-morning. There will be some light rain associated with this front. Moderate winds will initially be South-Easterly but will veer South-Westerly and strengthen during the day.

Warm today at lower levels as the snowpack steadily disappears.
