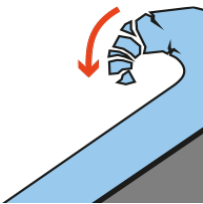

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 13/03/2017

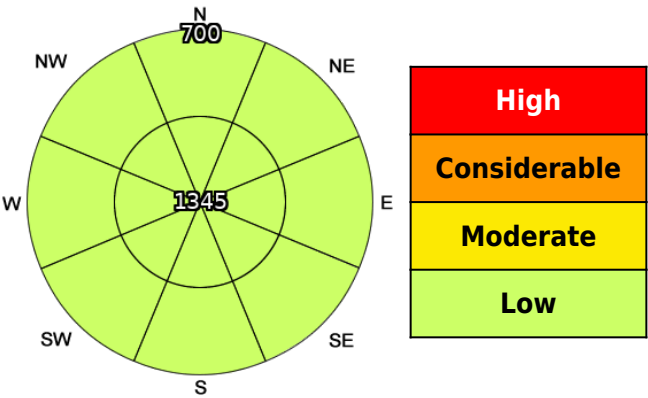
Avalanche Problems



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will consolidate further in the colder overnight temperatures and will be well bonded and generally stable. Fresh snow amounts overnight are not expected to be significant. Remaining cornices will be prone to collapse particularly as the temperature rises in the afternoon and wet snow surface instabilities will be present on very steep slopes at this time. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate to strong South-Westerly winds. Showers overnight falling as snow on higher summits followed by a drier day with further rain at all levels at the end of the afternoon. Freezing level around 1000 metres rising above summit level in the afternoon.

Comments

Generally warm till Wednesday with colder weather and fresh snow forecast later in the week.
