Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to consolidate and be generally well bonded and stable in all locations. Surface instabilities are possible in very steep locations, also potential for full depth avalanche where the snowpack overlies steep rock slab terrain. Remaining cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

Cooler temperatures overnight with a short spell of sleet over the summits as freezing levels fall to around 1000 metres, mild through the day with freezing levels rising to above summit levels. Winds will be moderate to strong South-West to Westerly in direction.

Comments

Rockfall remains a potential hazard. A spell of cooler temperatures expected on Tuesday with gales and snow showers.
