

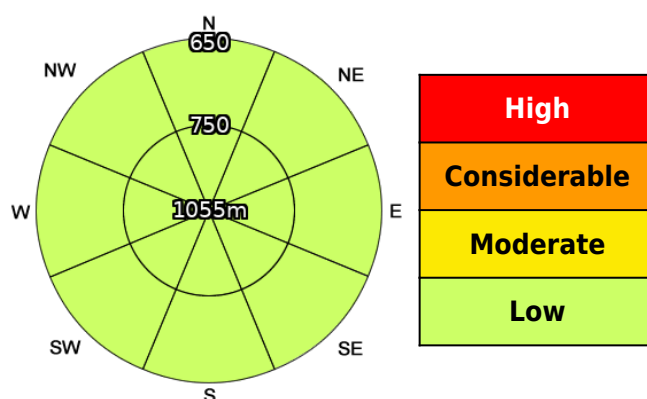

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 14/03/2017

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The stable and depleted existing snowpack will become very wet overnight, before beginning to re-freeze and become firmer at higher elevations later. Small amounts of windslab will accumulate throughout the day in localised sheltered areas, mainly steep slopes, North-East to South-East aspects above 750 metres. Any remaining old cornices will generally remain stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Westerly gales, with severe gales at summit level will persist through the day. Overnight, a band of heavy rain at all levels will ease and turn showery by daybreak, falling as snow above 750 metres as the freezing level dips below the summits. Snow amounts are expected to be small.

Comments

The thaw will slow tomorrow with colder conditions, but turning mild again later.
