



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 15/03/2017

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The limited snowpack will remain stable and well consolidated with insignificant amounts of fresh snow possible at higher elevations. Most existing snow will remain above 800 metres, North to East aspects in patches, strips and runnels, where it will be firmer at summit level. Many areas will remain bare. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers will largely die out overnight and the Westerly gales will gradually ease. Rain at all levels will arrive by early afternoon and simultaneously, the wind will strengthen, back South-West and the freezing level will rise well above the summits.

Comments

Looks like there will be cycles of wet and windy, dry and calm periods with fluctuating temperatures and limited amounts of fresh snow.
