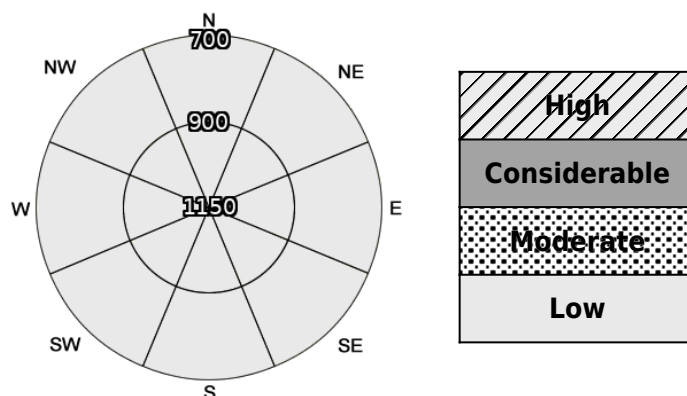


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 16/03/2017****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The patchy snow cover will be generally well bonded and stable. Soft surface layers initially will gradually start to firm up at highest elevations as the freezing level lowers. There will be a trace of new snow with shallow accumulations forming on North-East to South-East aspects. These new accumulations are not expected to be significant in depth. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Patchy light rain or drizzle will turn to light snow during the early afternoon. Strong to gale force South-Westerly veering Westerly winds. The freezing level will be above the summits overnight, lowering to around 600 metres by the very end of the period.

Further snow showers expected on Friday. Turning milder on Saturday.
