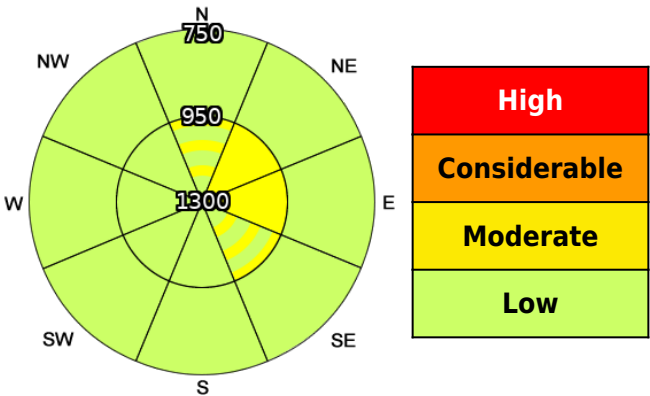
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The limited snowpack will remain soft but stable overnight on all aspects and at all levels, this will progressively refreeze as the day progresses. New deposits of moderately windslab will gradually build on mostly North to Easterly aspects above 950 metres with coire rims, gully exits most affected especially where deposits gain depth. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels well above the summits overnight lowering to 500 metres from morning. Winds moderate to strong South-Westerly overnight and during the day veering Westerly in the afternoon. Precipitation falling as rain at all levels in the morning progressively falling as snow showers in the afternoon as it cools. Snow lying above 400 metres.

Comments

Getting cooler with snowfall during the afternoon.
Rockfall remains a hazard below crags especially am.
