

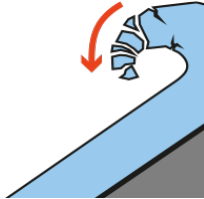

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Windslab will continue to build poor to moderately bonded accumulations on mostly steep North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres, gully exits, coire rims and coire back-walls with deep convex shaped deposits will be especially affected. North and South aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. Cornices above these aspects will be liable to collapse. Below 950 metres, snow cover will be mostly thin and generally stable where deeper. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable

Forecast Weather Influences

Winds moderate strength West-North-Westerly overnight with snowfall above 600 metres, winds strengthening from the morning backing strong West-South-Westerly with no precipitation expected but with drifting snow.
