



**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 20/03/2017**





**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

At first there will be some further consolidation of the existing snow pack in the cooler temperatures. However fresh wind slab accumulations will develop as the snow showers arrive. These accumulations will build on to high wind sheltered corrie rims and gully tops on North through East to South-East aspects above 750 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Strong South-West winds will increase to gale force by tomorrow morning veering West-South-Westerly. The Freezing level will lower from 750 metres overnight to around 500 metres by tomorrow. Moderate scattered snow showers are expected throughout the period.

**Comments**

An obvious depletion in the snow pack this morning, but moderate snow showers are expected on gale force winds, windslab will develop.
