
Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised accumulations will form on mainly North-West through North-East to South-East aspects. Above 900 metres where deposits achieve depth over older snow-ice they will be moderately bonded. Greatest hazard will be found in gully exits and around corrie rims. Elsewhere older snow will become firm and icy with light new accumulations to lower levels. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be light snowfall throughout the day above around 600 metres. Winds will initially be from the South but will veer and strengthen from the West-South-West, then West by the end of the day.

Comments

Becoming colder with some snowfall likely to lower levels.
