
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain frozen hard and stable in all areas. Greatest amounts are on North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. New localised deposits of wind slab will form in wind sheltered places on mainly North-East to East aspects above 950 metres, with gully exits and below coire rims most affected. Elsewhere terrain will be wind scoured and stable or bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing level around 500 metres with precipitation falling as snow, mostly overnight, to low levels. Easing winds will be strong West-South-Westerly throughout the forecast period.

Comments

Winds leasing, remaining wintry. Old snowpack very firm and icy. Moderate confidence in snow amounts.
