

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain frozen hard and stable in all areas, greatest amounts on Northerly to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Localised deposits of moderately bonded windslab will be present in steep wind sheltered places on mainly North-East to East aspects above 950 metres, with coire back walls and convex shaped areas below coire rims most affected. Elsewhere snow cover will be thin and areas will be wind scoured and stable or bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Occasional light snow showers overnight and during the day. Winds strong West-South-Westerly overnight, veering and becoming moderate strength North-Easterly. Freezing level around 500 metres.

Comments

Remaining wintry but a brighter and calmer day in prospect.
