
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight localised areas of wind slab will continue to build on North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. In the day redistributed snow will form localised windslab deposits onto most high aspects above 800 metres. Cross loading is likely. These windslab deposits will be localised, mainly affecting steep high places such as gully tops and corrie headwalls on South-East through South-West to North-West aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong West-South-West winds will diminish in strength to become fresh North-Easterly tomorrow. At first there will be some light snow showers overnight clearing in the morning to give a dry day. The Freezing level will hover around 500 metres.
