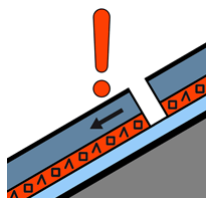
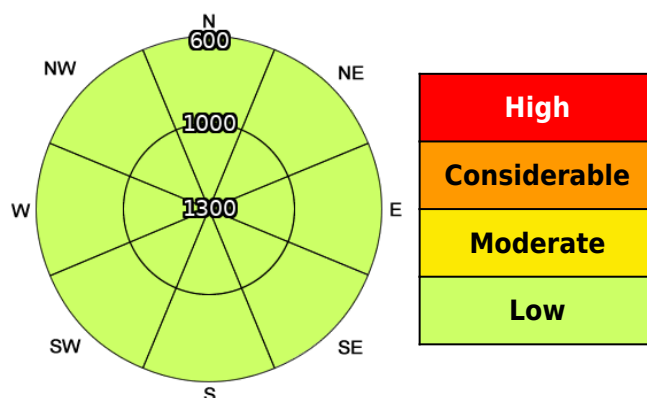


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 23/03/2017****Avalanche Problems****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Little change is expected and the general snowpack will remain shallow on all aspects. Weaknesses will persist in localised areas of windslab, particularly where it gains depth on steep slopes, North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres, where summit ridge flanks, gullies, gully exits and crag aprons will be affected. Elsewhere, the snowpack is generally well consolidated and some sun affected areas will be bare. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

High pressure will dominate, giving a dry and mostly clear sunny day. The cool and fresh North-East wind will ease overnight, veering and becoming a light South-Westerly by the end of the day. It will feel warm in the sun and the freezing level will rise from 300 metres to 800 metres through the day.

Comments

Expect a few days dominated by high pressure with good walking conditions. Very thin ice observed in the northern coires of Liathach.
