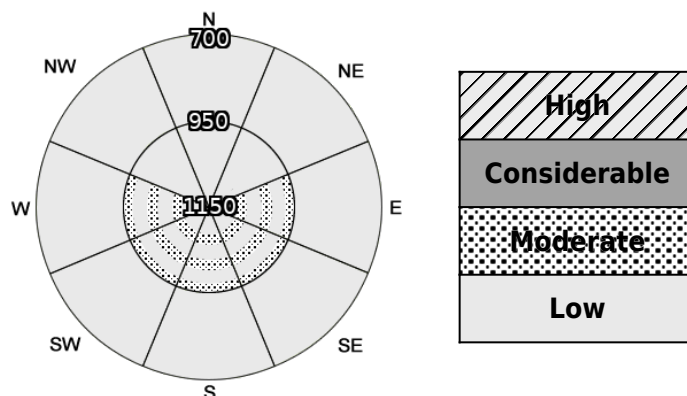
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The patchy older snow will be very firm and stable with greatest amounts mainly on North to East aspects above 900 metres. Localised areas of moderately bonded windslab will be present in sheltered steep locations on East through South to West aspects above 950 metres with greatest hazard found in gully exits and around corrie rims. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Generally expected to be dry but light snow flurries possible in the morning. The freezing level will rise to around 900 metres during the day. The overnight strong North-Easterly airflow will ease and veer to become a light South-Easterly.

Comments

New areas of windslab will be very localised. Older snow becoming very icy.
