
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

In most areas the snowpack will be generally stable. Some isolated areas of unstable windslab will be present in wind sheltered places on South to West aspects above 1000 metres, most affected will be places where it gains depth on steep and convex terrain below coire rims and high in coire head walls. Elsewhere snow cover will be thin and areas will be wind scoured and stable or bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Moderate Strength East-North-Easterly winds overnight will veer South-Easterly and ease to light strength during the day. Freezing levels will be mostly 500 metres rising to 900 metres by the end of the period. It will be mostly dry with the odd dusting of snow.
