

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 24/03/2017


Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The general snowpack will remain shallow and well consolidated, becoming patchy at lower levels. Minor weaknesses will persist in localised areas of windslab, mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Most affected will be very steep slopes where the windslab gains depth, mainly in gullies, gully exits, summit ridge flanks and crag aprons. Many South facing slopes will be bare. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry and generally cloudy day is forecast, with a fresh to strong South-Westerly wind persisting through the day. It will feel warm as the freezing level rises and remains above the summits by daybreak.
