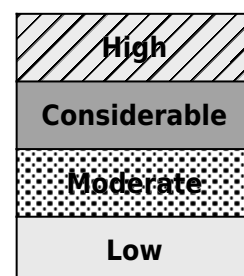
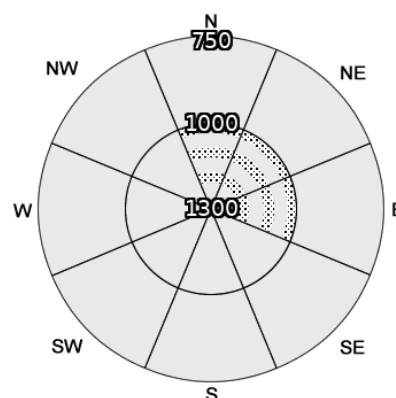
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be stable in most areas, recent windslab deposits will become more consolidated. Some light drifting possible with localised windslab developing on North to East aspects above 1000 metres. Areas most affected will be where it gains depth around sheltered areas such as corrie rims, gully tops and steep convex terrain. Elsewhere the snowpack will be firm and wind scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry with freezing levels gradually rising to above the summits during the morning. Light Southerly winds will veer West-South-Westerly and increase to moderate over the tops through the day.

Comments

Very firm snow ice with serious run out potential on steep slopes.
