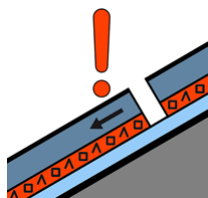
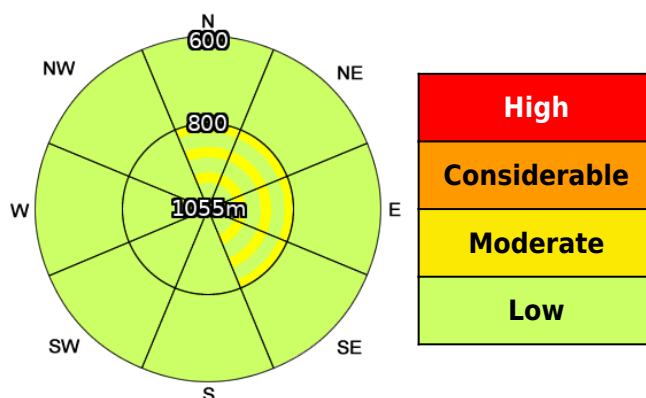


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 25/03/2017****Avalanche Problems****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The shallow and diminishing snowpack will generally remain well consolidated and stable with the main snowline around 600 metres. However, minor weaknesses will persist in localised areas of windslab, particularly where it gains depth on very steep North through East to South-East aspects and mainly above 800 metres. Elsewhere, many South to West facing slopes and some summits will be bare. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

A dry and mostly sunny day is expected, perhaps partly cloudy in the morning and mild with the freezing level remaining well above the summits. A fresh, generally South-West wind will persist throughout the period.

Comments

High pressure will dominate with good weather forecasted. The snowpack will continue to consolidate in the milder temperatures.
