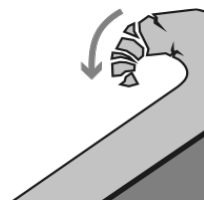

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 27/03/2017

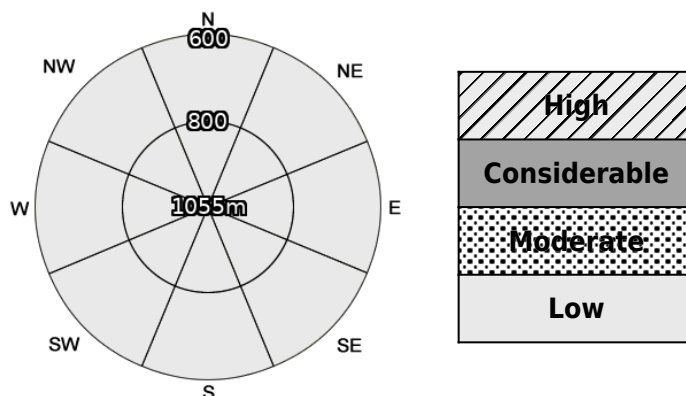
Avalanche Problems



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack which is mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres will firm up overnight and soften through the day, continue to consolidate and be generally stable. On the same aspects there will be some isolated minor instabilities in the deeper older snow pack accumulations on steep scarp slopes, the few remaining cornices will be fragile. Most South to West facing slopes are bare of snow with wind exposed ridges scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

The East winds will remain light become variable and will be South to South-Easterly by tomorrow afternoon. No precipitation is forecast with the freezing level remaining above the summits.
