

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 28/03/2017


Avalanche Problems



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected with the snowpack that is present on mostly North-East to South-East aspects above 950 metres, it will remain well bonded and stable in all locations. During the day the surface layers will soften especially on any sun exposed slopes with potential surface instabilities developing on steep terrain. Cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Low



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be light to moderate strength North-Easterly at first veering Southerly then South-Westerly and freshening. Freezing levels will be above summit levels throughout the day. A dry day is expected but some light precipitation, with snow flurries on the tops may occur.

Snowpack firm and icy on steep shaded Northerly aspects with serious run-outs onto rocks
