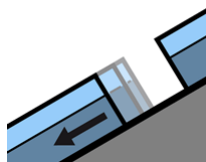
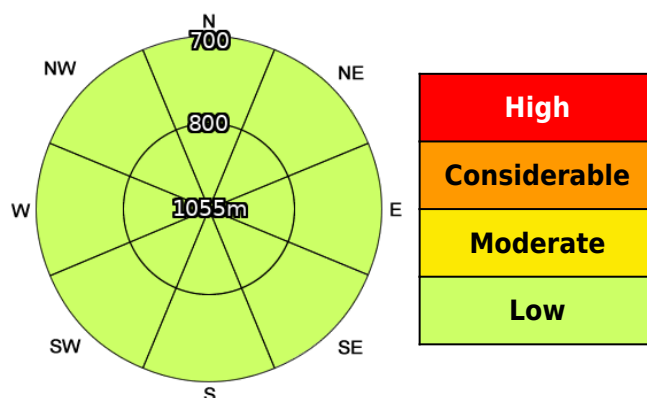

The much depleted and patchy snowpack will continue to thaw and remain wet at all levels, but will be generally well consolidated and stable on all aspects. Wet snow instabilities may occur affecting the most extensive areas of snow on very steep slopes above 800 metres. Many hillsides, summits and summits ridges will be bare. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will remain very mild with persistent light rain and drizzle throughout and accompanied by extensive hill cloud. The overnight fresh South-East wind will ease in the morning, veering South-West and freshening later.

Comments

The heavy thaw will continue in very mild temperatures combined with 'warm' rainfall.
