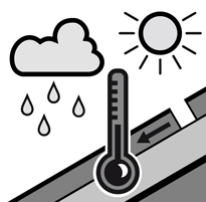


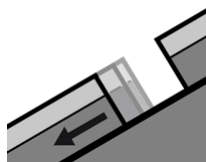

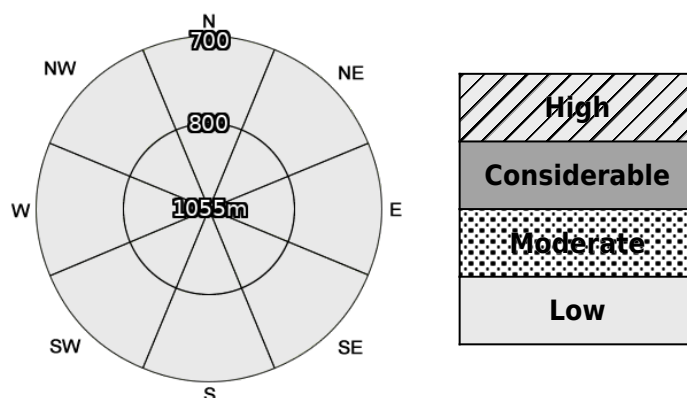
Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The limited snowpack which is mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres will continue to deplete and remain generally stable. Any new snow that falls on the higher summits will have a minimal impact. Much of the terrain is free of snow although isolated wet snow instabilities are possible on terrain above 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong South-West winds will veer West overnight reducing in strength becoming fresh West-North- Westerly. The freezing level will lower to around 1100 metres by tomorrow with some overnight rain showers with only the chance of light amounts of snow on the highest summits. Tomorrow will be dry.
