
##### Avalanche Problems

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The remaining depleted snowpack which is very patchy mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres will continue to thaw. Isolated wet snow instabilities may be present on very high terrain where deeper older patches of snow remain however these should be avoidable and will mainly be on steep gully top exits and corrie rims. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

It will be dry at first with heavy rain showers expected by mid morning tomorrow. The freezing level will remain above summit levels. Winds will be gale force Southerly.

##### Comments

DAILY Torridon Avalanche forecasts end for the 2016/17 winter season. However, we will continue to monitor weather and snow conditions leading up to and during the Easter holidays.
