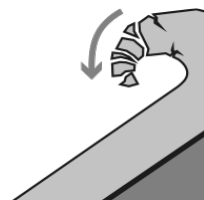
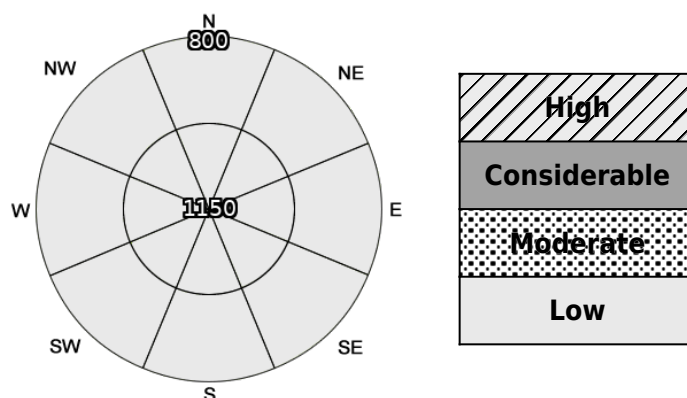


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 03/04/2017****Avalanche Problems****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack will gradually thaw until the afternoon when it will become softer and more moist in the rainfall. Localised wet snow surface instabilities may then occur on steep ground, however snowpack stability will remain generally good. There will be potential for rockfall and remaining cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Remaining dry until the afternoon when there will be some heavy rain. The freezing level will be above the summits. The wind will be a variable Southerly strengthening, becoming strong to gale force by the afternoon.
