



### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The rapid thaw will continue in the extremely mild conditions. Surface layers will be soft but stability will be generally good. Deepest snow cover will be found in sheltered locations on mainly East through South to South-West aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.





#### **Forecast Weather Influences**

A dry but overcast day with variable cloud cover. Remaining mild with the freezing level initially well above the summits, lowering to around 1500 metres by the end of the period. Winds overnight strong South-Westerly decreasing to moderate, becoming fresh, generally Westerly, during daylight hours.

#### **Comments**

Falling ice may be a problem in steeper locations during the prolonged and intense thaw.
